## Inflation Rate for January 2013 is 8.8%

### The Consumer Price Index

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) measures the change over time in the general price level of goods and services that households acquire for the purpose of consumption, with reference to the price level in 2002, the base year, which has an index of 100.

### January 2013 rate of inflation

The year-on-year inflation as measured by the CPI stood at 8.8 per cent in January 2013, the same as recorded in December 2012 (Table 1). This rate of inflation for January 2013 is the percentage change in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) over the twelve-month period from January 2012 (379.3) to January 2013 (412.6).

The monthly change rate for January 2013 was 2.1 per cent. As indicated in Table 1, the monthly rate recorded in December 2012 was 0.7 percent.

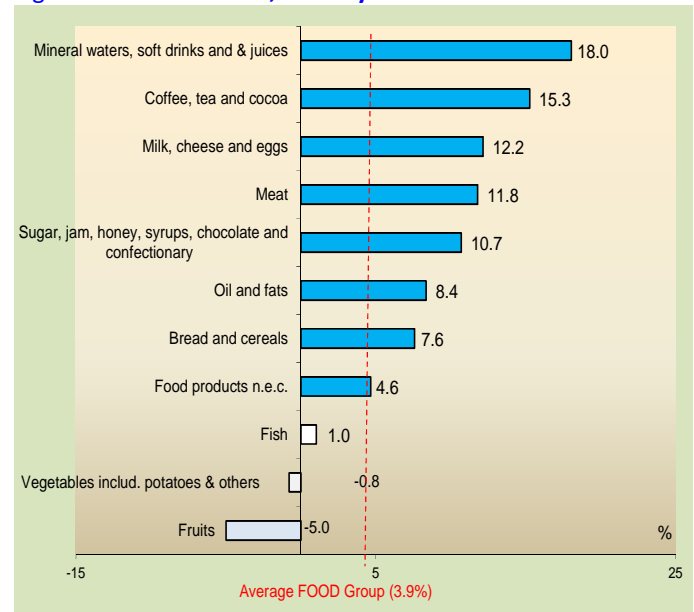
### Food and non-food inflation

The **Food and non-alcoholic beverages** group recorded an average year-on-year inflation rate of 3.9 per cent, the same as recorded in December 2012. Eight subgroups of the food and non-alcoholic beverages

group recorded inflation rates above the group’s average inflation rate of 3.9 per cent (Figure 1).

**The non-food** group recorded a year-on-year inflation rate of 11.5 per cent in January 2013 compared to 11.6 per cent recorded in December 2012. Seven subgroups recorded year-on-year inflation rates above the group’s average rate (Figure 2). **Education** recorded the highest rate of 21.9 per cent followed by **Alcoholic beverages, tobacco and narcotics** (17.0 %) and **Clothing and Footwear** (16.3%). Inflation was lowest in the **Communications** subgroup (0.4%).

## Regional differentials

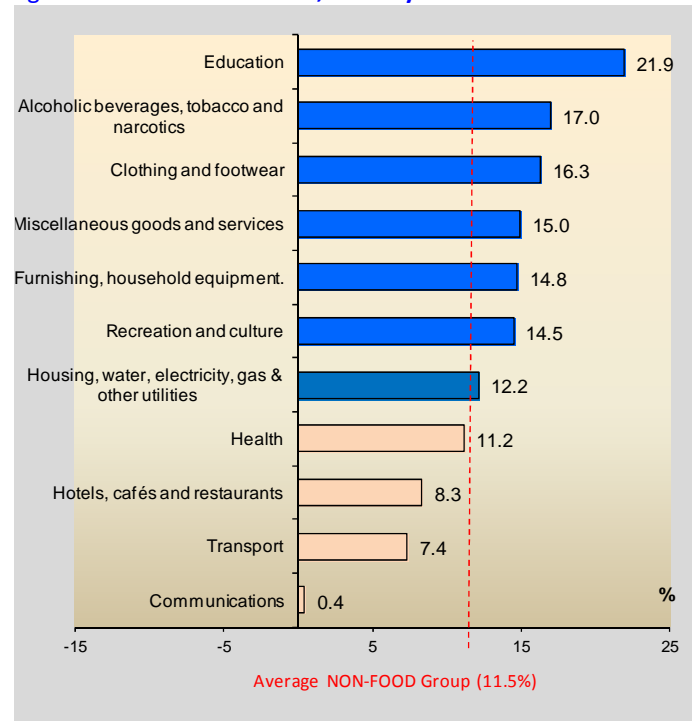
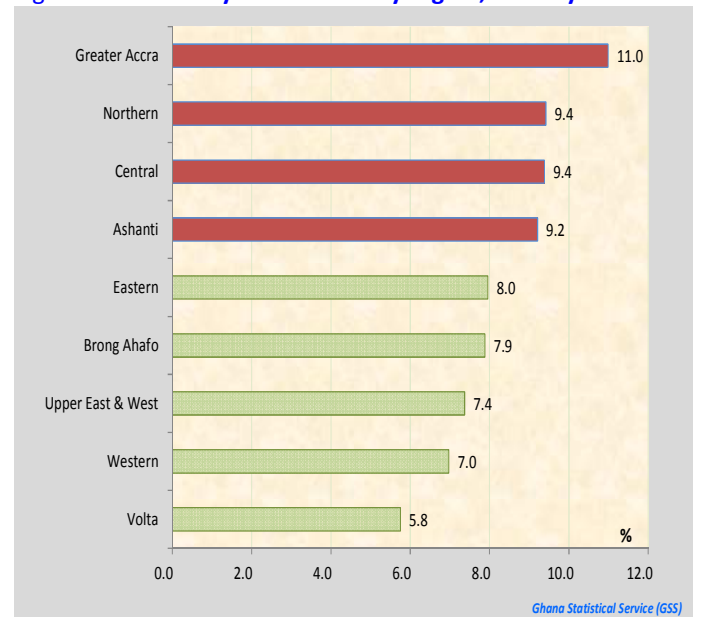


Figure 3: Year –on-year Inflation by region, January 2013

At the regional level, the year-on-year inflation rate ranged from 5.8 per cent in the Volta Region to 11.0 per cent in the Greater Accra Region. **Four regions** (Greater Accra, Central, Northern and Ashanti) recorded inflation rates above the national average of 8.8 per cent (Figure 3).

Figure 2: Non Food Inflation, January 2013

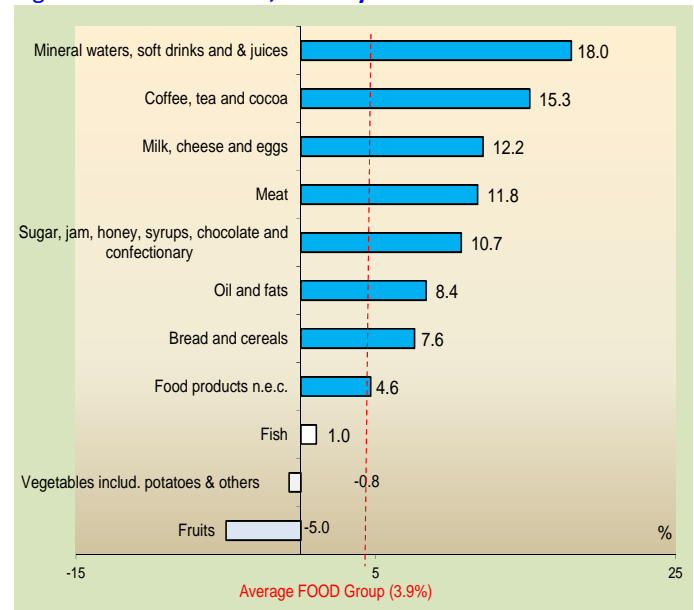

Figure 2: Non Food Inflation, January 2013

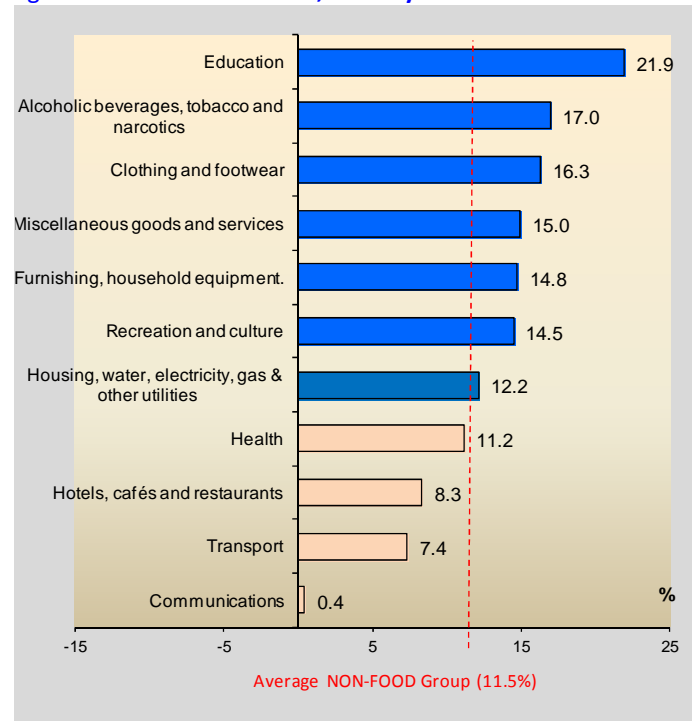
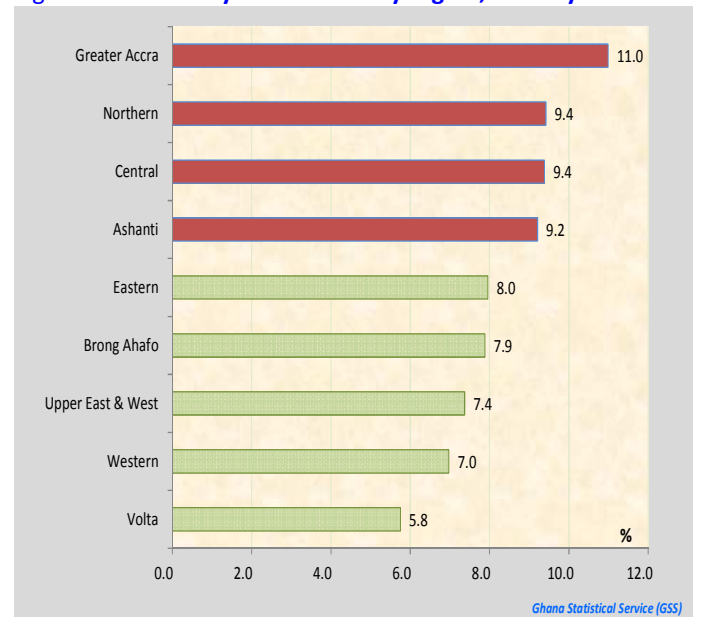


Figure 3: Year –on-year Inflation by region, January 2013

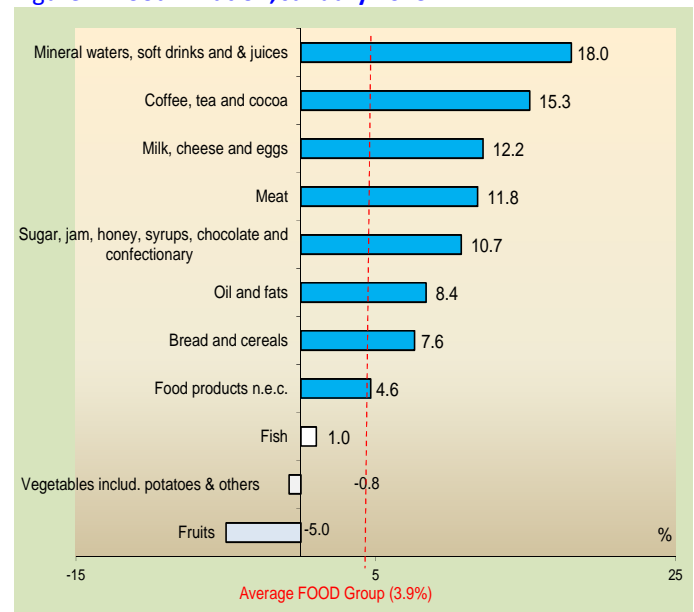

Figure 2: Non Food Inflation, January 2013

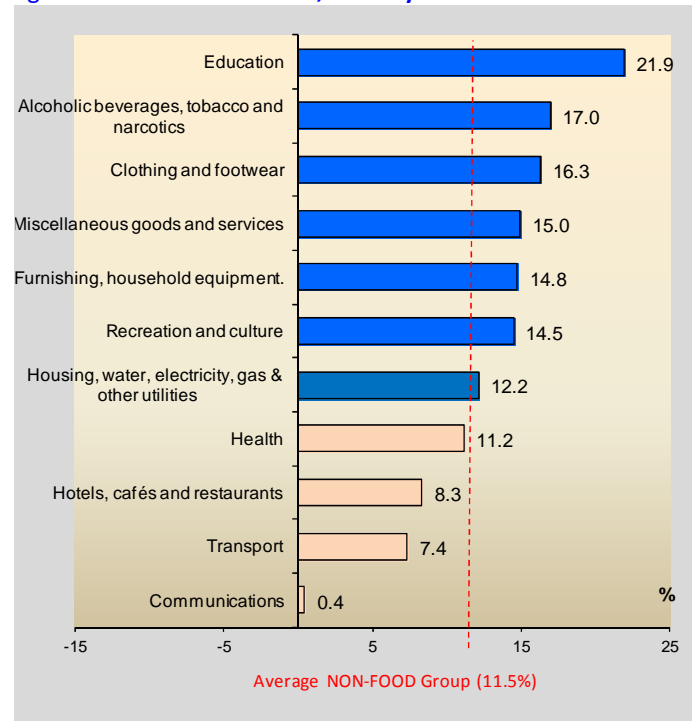


Figure 3: Year –on-year Inflation by region, January 2013
