Producer Price Inflation Rate in September 2017 is 7.6%

The Producer Price Index

The Producer Price Index (PPI) measures the average change over time in the prices received by domestic producers for the production of their goods and services. The PPI for Ghana reports the producer price indices with reference to September 2006, the base period. This release shows the annual (year-on-year) and monthly producer inflation rates for all industry and three major sub-sectors of industry (Mining and Quarrying, Manufacturing and Utilities) for the last twelve months. The figures for the month of September 2017 are provisional, and are subject to revision when additional data become available. All other indicators are final.

September 2017 Producer Inflation

The Producer Price Inflation rate for September 2017 was 7.6 percent. This rate indicates that, between September 2016 and September 2017 (year-on-year), the PPI increased by 7.6 percent. This rate represents a 1.0 percentage point increase in producer inflation relative to the rate recorded in August 2017 (6.6%). The month-on-month change in producer price index between August 2017 and September 2017 was 1.8 percent (Table 1).

The producer price inflation in the Mining and Quarrying sub-sector increased by 2.9 percentage points over the August 2017 rate of 8.3 percent to record 11.2 percent in September 2017. The producer inflation for Manufacturing which constitutes more than two-thirds of total industry increased by 1.0 percentage point, to record 8.5 percent. The utilities sub-sector recorded an inflation rate of 0.6 percent in September 2017 indicating a decrease of 0.7 percentage point compare with the August 2017 rate.

Trends

In September 2016, the producer price inflation rate for all industry was 9.7 percent. The rate increased marginally to 9.8 percent in October 2016, then to 11.9 percent in November 2016, but it declined consistently to record 3.1 percent in January 2017. In February 2017, the rate increased to 5.4 percent and

then to 6.0 percent in March 2017 but declined consistently to record 2.0 percent in July 2017. In August 2017, the rate increased to 6.6 percent and then to 7.6 percent in September 2017.

Manufacturing Sector

During the month of September 2017, six out of the sixteen major groups in the manufacturing sub-sector recorded inflation rates higher than the sector average of 8.5 percent. Manufacture of coke, refined petroleum products recorded the highest inflation rate of 29.7 percent while manufacturing of electrical machinery and apparatus n.e.c recorded the lowest producer price inflation rate of -1.8% (Fig. 2).

Petroleum Price Index


The producer inflation rate in the petroleum subsector was -14.8 percent in September 2016. The rate increased to -0.1 percent in December 2016. In January 2017, the rate declined to -6.9 percent but increased consistently to 5.3 percent in March 2017. It declined to -1.2 percent in April 2017 and then to -4.5 percent in May 2017. Subsequently, it increased consistently to record 29.7 percent in September 2017 (Fig 3).


Highlights


The year-on-year producer inflation for all industry was 7.6 percent in September 2017; the monthly change rate was 1.8 percent.

The Mining and Quarrying sub-sector recorded the highest year-on-year producer price inflation rate of 11.2 percent followed by the Manufacturing sub-sector with 8.5 percent. The Utilities sub-sector recorded the lowest year-on-year producer inflation rate of 0.6 percent.

With respect to the monthly changes, Mining and Quarrying recorded the highest rate of 3.0 percent followed by the Manufacturing sub-sector with 1.9 percent. The Utilities sub-sector recorded no change.
