

2022 GHANA DEMOGRAPHIC AND HEALTH SURVEY WOMEN EMPOWEREMENT



This factsheet presents statistics on access to financial service, asset ownership, women's economic empowerment and participation in decision-making in Ghana using data from the 2021 Population and Housing Census and the 2022 Demographic and Health Survey. The results reveal significant disparities in women's economic inclusion by district, region, and marital status, underscoring persistent structural and socio-cultural barriers. Access to financial services emerges as a pivotal factor, strongly linked to greater participation in household decision-making processes.


Access to financial services refers to an individual's ability to obtain and use affordable financial products and services that meet their needs.

Asset ownership refers to the possession of key assets such as land or houses. Women are classified as asset owners if they report owning land or a house alone, jointly or both.

Economic empowerment as defined by UN, this involves ensuring women can equally participate in and benefit from decent work and social protection; access markets and have control over resources, their own time, lives, and bodies; and increased voice, agency, and meaningful participation in economic decision-making at all levels from the household to international institutions.

Participation in decision-making refers to women having equal opportunities to participate in decision making process regarding their own health care, decisions on large household purchases and visits to family and relatives

Key takeaways and Policy Recommendations

Key Takeaways

- 1. Severe regional gaps in access to financial services: Women in districts such as Yunyoo-Nasuan, Tatale Sangule, Saboba, Mion, and Kpandai recorded access levels less than half those in Greater Accra, where access is consistently high.
- 2. Asset ownership favors currently married women: Across Ghana, married women show higher percentages of asset ownership compared to unmarried women, reflecting disparities in household resource distribution.
- 3. Empowerment levels for married women exceed 70% in Western, Bono, Ashanti, and Greater Accra, while unmarried women in North East, Savannah, Upper East, and Northern regions often fall below 40%.
- 4. In urban areas such as Greater Accra, over 90% of married women participate in household decision-making, while in the Eastern Region, several districts fall below 70%

Policy Recommendations

- 1. Expand financial inclusion in low-access districts particularly in areas where women's financial service access is less than half that of Greater Accra to close regional gaps.
- 2. **Reform property and asset laws** to improve women's ownership, ensuring measures benefit both married women who currently show 70%+ empowerment in some regions and unmarried women who fall **below 40%** in many northern districts.
- 3. Invest in targeted empowerment programs, including mobile banking, entrepreneurship, and leadership training, focusing on regions where decision-making participation drops below 70% and empowerment is **below 40%**.
- 4. Strengthen gender-disaggregated data systems across government, private sector, and CSOs to better track gaps in financial access, asset ownership, empowerment, and decision-making across districts and demographic groups.
