# Summary

- National inflation from July 2020 to July 2021 was 9.0%.
- National month-on-month inflation from June 2021 to July 2021 was 1.6%.
- Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages inflation was 9.5% and Non-Food inflation 8.6%.
- Regional inflation was between 13.7% in Upper West Region and 3.0% in Eastern Region.

## Government Statistician Says:

"Greater Accra's persistebtly record of highest inflation of sixteen consecutive months has been halted by Northern region."

### July 2021 Inflation




Figure 1: Year-on-year inflation July 2021 and the average over the last 12 months, by Division.

The national year-on-year inflation rate was 9.0% in July 2021, which is more than one percentage point higher than the 7.8% recorded in June 2021 (see Table 1). Month-on-month inflation between June and July 2021 was 1.6% (0.3 percentage point higher than what was recorded in June and 0.8 higher than in May). 'Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas' (14.1% down from 14.2% last month) recorded the highest inflation. See Figure 1, for the inflation rates of all Divisions.

## **Regional Inflation**

At the regional level, the overall year-on-year inflation ranged from 3.0% in Eastern Region to 13.8% in Upper West Region (see Figure 3). Upper West Region also recorded the highest month-on-month inflation (4.5%) (see Figure 5). Especially the northern three regions of Ghana (Upper West, Upper East and Northern Region), saw high (Food) inflation and an increase in inflation as compared to last month (see Figure 7).




Figure 2: National month-on-month inflation rates for different Divisions.





Figure 3: Year-on-year overall, Food and Non-Food inflation rates for July 2021 by region.




Figure 5: Heatmap tabulating the month-on-month inflation statistics for 10 regions and 13 Divisions in addition to the National and Overall averages. The month-on-month inflation for the period June 2021 to July 2021 is given, as well as the month-on-month inflation for June 2020 to July 2020 and the average month-on-month inflation between August 2020 and July 2021.

Looking at Figure 5, it becomes clear that in six regions month-on-month Food Inflation was above 2%. As shown in Figure 5, on a month-on-month basis, Upper West Region recorded the highest overall inflation (4.6%) and Greater Accra Region the lowest (-1.0%).

### Imported and Local Inflation

The inflation for imported goods was 7.1% (up from 7.0% last month), while the inflation for locally produced items was 9.4% on average (up from the 7.9% recorded last month). Month-on-month inflation for imported goods was 1.0% and for locally produced goods 1.8%.




Figure 6: Composition of year-on-year inflation. Total height indicates total inflation and percentages indicate the contribution to total inflation. For all months, the contribution of the `Transport', `Housing' and `Food' Divisions is shown and for the current month, the contribution of all 13 Divisions is shown on the right side of the plot.




Figure 7: Both Food and Non-Food inflation by region.
