

Newsletter Consumer Price Index (CPI) November 2021



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Summary

- National inflation from November 2020 to November 2021 was 12.2%.
- National month-on-month inflation from October 2021 to November 2021 was 1.4%.
- Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages inflation was 13.1% and Non-Food inflation 11.6%.
- Regional inflation was between 17.2% in Upper West region and 2.7% in the Eastern Region.

November 2021 Inflation

The national year-on-year inflation rate was 12.2% in November 2021, which is 1.2 percentage points higher than the 11.0% recorded in October 2021 (see Table 1). Monthon-month inflation between October and November 2021 was 1.4%. 'Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and other Fuels' (20.5%) recorded the highest inflation (see Figure 11, for the inflation rates of all Divisions).




Figure 1: Year-on-year inflation November 2021 and the average over the last 12 months, by Division.


Regional Inflation





Figure 3: Year-on-year overall, Food and Non-Food inflation rates for November 2021 by region.




Figure 5: Heatmap tabulating the month-on-month inflation statistics for 10 regions and 13 Divisions in addition to the National and Overall averages. The month-on-month inflation for the period September 2021 to October 2021 is given, as well as the month-on-month inflation for September 2020 to October 2021 and the average month-on-month inflation between November 2020 and October 2021.

At the regional level, the overall year-on-year inflation ranged from 2.7% in the Eastern Region to 17.2% in the Upper West Region (See Figure 3). Greater Accra Region recorded the highest month on month inflation (2.0%) (See Figure 5). All regions recorded positive month-on-month inflation rates with Upper East region recording the lowest (0.3%).









Food and Non-Food Inflation




Figure 6: Composition of year-on-year inflation. Total height indicates total inflation and percentages indicate the contribution to total inflation. For all months, the contribution of the `Transport', `Housing' and `Food' Divisions is shown and for the current month, the contribution of all 13 Divisions is shown on the right side of the plot.

This month food inflation (13.1%) is higher than both last month food inflation (11.5%) and the average of the previous 12 months (10.4%). Food inflation's contribution to total inflation increased from 44.9% last month to 47.7% in November (see Figure 6). Overall month-on-month food inflation was 2.1%, which is higher than the twelve month national month-on-month rolling average of food inflation (1.0%). All the fifthteen food subclasses recorded positive month-on-month inflation (see figure 4) with Vegetables recording the highest (3.8%).

Non-food year-on-year inflation on average went up again this month compared to last month (from 11.0% to 11.6%). Only one out of the 12 Non-food Divisions had the 12 months rolling average to be higher than the year-on-year inflation for November 2021 (See Figure 1). Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas other fuels recorded the highest inflation this month (20.5%).

Figure 2: National month-on-month inflation rates for different Divisions.

Greater Accra region recorded the highest month-on-month inflation for November 2021 (4.4%) as shown in Figure 5. Recreation, Sport and Culture, and Food and Non-alcoholic Beverages are the Divisions with higher month-on-month inflation across all the regions.

Imported and Local Inflation

The inflation for imported goods was 9.8% (higher than the 8.8% recorded for last month) while the inflation for locally produced items was 13.0% (up from the 11.8% recorded last month).

Figure 4: Year-on-year and month-on-month Food Subclass inflation, November 2021.




Figure 7: Both year-on-year and month-on-month inflation by region.
