

HIGHLIGHTS FOR JANUARY 2018

Inflation for January 2018 is 10.3%

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) measures the change over time in the general price level of goods and services that households acquire for the purpose of consumption, with reference to the price level in 2012, the base year, which has an index of 100.

The year-on-year inflation rate as measured by the CPI was10.3 percent in January 2018 down by 1.5 percentage points from the 11.8 percent recorded in December 2017(Figure 1). This rate of inflation for January 2018 is the percentage change in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) over the twelve-month period, from January 2017 to January 2018.



The monthly change rate for January 2018 was 1.4 percent compared with the 1.0 percent recorded in December 2017.

Food and non-food inflation for January 2018


The Food and non-alcoholic beverages group recorded a year-on-year inflation rate of 6.8 percent. This is 1.2 percentage points lower than the 8.0 percent recorded in December 2017. Six subgroups of the food and non-alcoholic beverages group recorded an inflation rate higher

than the group's average rate of 6.8 percent. The subgroups were Fruits (9.2%), Vegetables (8.4%), Coffee, tea and cocoa (8.2%), Mineral water, soft drinks, fruit and vegetable juices (7.7%), Food products n.e.c (7.4%) and Meat and meat products (7.3%).

The non-food group recorded a year-on-year inflation rate of 12.0 percent in January 2018, compared to the rate of 13.6 percent recorded in December 2017. Five subgroups of the non-food group recorded year-on-year inflation rates higher than the group's average rate of 12.0 percent. Transport (17.9%), Clothing and footwear (16.7%), Recreation and Culture (13.7%), Miscellaneous goods and services (12.7%) and Furnishing, Household Equipment and Routine Maintenance (12.1%)

.Regional differentials


At the regional level, the year-on-year inflation rate ranged from 7.8 percent in the Upper East Region to 12.1 percent in Upper West region. Four regions (Upper West, Brong Ahafo, Ashanti and Greater Accra,) recorded inflation rates above the national average of 10.3 percent. Upper East region recorded the lowest inflation rate (7.8%).



Year- on-year inflation by regions







