
HIGHLIGHTS FOR JANUARY 2014

Inflation Rate for January 2014 is 13.8%

The new Consumer Price Index (CPI) measures the change over time in the general price level of goods and services that households acquire for the purpose of consumption, with reference to the price level in 2012, the base year, which has an index of 100.

The year-on-year inflation as measured by the CPI stood at 13.8 percent in January 2014, up from the 13.5 percent recorded in December 2013. This rate of inflation for January 2014 is the percentage change in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) over the twelve-month period, from January 2013 to January 2014.

Monthly Inflation

The monthly change rate for January 2014 was 3.9 percent, against the 1.0 per cent recorded in December 2013.

Food and non-food inflation for January 2014

The Food and non-alcoholic beverages group recorded an average year-on-year inflation rate of 7.1 percent, 0.1 percentage points lower than the 7.2 percent recorded in December 2013.

Four subgroups of the food and non-alcoholic beverages group recorded inflation rates above the group's average of 7.1 percent. These are: Coffee, tea and Cocoa; Milk, Cheese and Eggs; Meats and meat products; and Mineral water, soft drinks, fruit and vegetable juice.

Non-food inflation for January 2014

The non-food group recorded an average year-on-year inflation rate of 18.9 percent in January 2014, compared to a rate of 18.1 percent recorded in December 2013.

Four subgroups recorded year-on-year inflation rates above the group's average rate. These are as follows: Housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels (37.9%); Transport (21.4%), Clothing and Footwear (20.1%) and Miscellaneous goods and services (19.2%).

Communications subgroup recorded the lowest inflation rate of 5 percent.

Regional differentials

At the regional level, the year-on-year inflation rate ranged from 10.5 percent in the Upper West region to 16.9 per cent in the Ashanti Region.

Three regions (Central, Eastern and Ashanti) recorded inflation rates above the national average of 13.8 percent.

Year- on-year inflation by region











Regional Inflation Rates (Year-on-Year) - January 2014


